Daniel 8-12 contains the most detailed description of the end times

And this gospel of the kingdom will be proclaimed throughout the whole world as a testimony to all nations, and then the end will come.

So when you see the abomination of desolation spoken of by the prophet Daniel, standing in the holy place (let the reader understand), then let those who are in Judea flee to the mountains.

(Matt 24:14-15)

4 instances the Abomination of Desolation is mentioned: Dan 8:13, 9:27, 11:31, 12:11

Daniel 8

- Concerns the appointed time of the end (19)
- Medo-Persian empire (two horned ram) will be replaced by Greek empire (shaggy goat with large horn) (20-21)
- Greek empire broken into 4 empires: Ptolemaic Kingdom of Egypt, the Seleucid Empire in the east, the Kingdom of Pergamon in Asia Minor, and Macedon. (22)
- A king arises: small horn who grew in power from the South (9), Fierce looking king, master of intrigue (23).
- Conquest moves to Israel (9): exalts itself, astounding devastation (24), removes daily sacrifice and tramples underfoot the Lord's people (13).
- Abomination of desolation (11–13)
- He will be destroyed, but not by human power (25)

Mystery of Godliness

(1 Tim 3:16)

For God so loved the world, that <u>he gave his only Son</u>, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. (John 3:16)

Great indeed, we confess, is the <u>mystery of godliness</u>: <u>He was manifested in the flesh</u>, vindicated by the Spirit, seen by angels, proclaimed among the nations, believed on in the world, taken up in glory.

Understanding the Mystery of Lawlessness is impt to anchor our hearts

Now concerning the <u>coming of our Lord Jesus Christ</u> and our being gathered together to him, we ask you, brothers, <u>not to be quickly shaken in mind or alarmed</u>, either by a spirit or a spoken word, or a letter seeming to be from us, to the effect that the day of the Lord has come. Let no one deceive you in any way. <u>For that day will not come, unless the rebellion comes first, and the man of lawlessness is revealed</u>, the son of destruction, who opposes and exalts himself against every so-called god or object of worship, so that he takes his seat in the temple of God, proclaiming himself to be God.

Understanding the Mystery of Lawlessness is impt to anchor our hearts

Do you not remember that when I was still with you I told you these things? And you know what is restraining him now so that he may be revealed in his time. For the mystery of lawlessness is already at work. Only he who now restrains it will do so until he is out of the way. And then the lawless one will be revealed, whom the Lord Jesus will kill with the breath of his mouth and bring to nothing by the appearance of his coming.

(2 Thes 2:1-8)

Little horn in Daniel 7 is the last king to be judged before eternal kingdom

I also wanted to know about the ten horns on its head and about the other horn that came up, before which three of them fell—the horn that looked more imposing than the others and that had eyes and a mouth that spoke boastfully. As I watched, this horn was waging war against the holy people and defeating them, until the Ancient of Days came and pronounced judgment in favor of the holy people of the Most High, and the time came when they possessed the kingdom.

(Dan 7:20-22)

Daniel receives more revelation 17 years later, recorded in Chapter 11

Orientation point: Dan 11:4 - Greek empire (broken into 4 empires)

Dan 11:5-20: Fulfilled in history (536 to 164 BC)

Preview of the little horn given in Antichus IV Ephiphanes

Dan 11:21-45 describes the rise of a "contemptible figure" - the same little horn (Dan 7, 8)

- 1. Rise: Not given the honour of royalty, seizes kingdom by intrigue
- 2. Covenant: Comes into agreement with prince of covenant (Israel)
- 3. AoD: Desecrates the temple, abolishes the daily sacrifice, set ups AoD
- 4. Blasphemy: Exalts himself above God, boastful words
- 5. Saints: Resisted by the people of God
- 6. Fate: Comes to his end

Decree to Die	It was the Father's will that Jesus' life was given as an atoning sacrifice for the sin of the world.	The Ancient of Days will proclaim judgment and the beast will be killed (Dan 7:26, 11:45).
Resurrection	Jesus is resurrected from the death, bringing eternal life with Him to those who believe (Heb 2:14-15).	The beast recovers from a mortal wound, but brings war and death (Rev 13:3, 17:8).
Kingdom	Jesus receives the eternal kingdom that will never pass away (Dan 7:14). He rules with the saints forever.	The beast receives a kingdom but it is destroyed by God's judgment (Dan 7:26, 11:44-45). He is tormented in the lake of fire forever (Rev 20:10).


Daniel 9-10

Daniel's 70 week Prophecy (Dan 9:24-27)



Daniel 12

6 Positive Trends of the End Times:

- 1. Understanding: The people who know their God, called the wise, will rise up (12:3)
- 2. Great harvest: The wise instruct many, leading them to righteousness (12:3)
- 3. Supernatural help: miracles, great exploits (11:32) and angelic ministry (12:1)
- 4. Faithful unto death: the saints are persecuted and martyred, but remain faithful (11:33)
- 5. All these occur in the most difficult 3.5 years of human history; in God's mercy, there is a pre-determined limit to the time of tribulation (12:1, Matt 24:21)
- 6. There is an appointed time of deliverance, where God himself will deliver them and bring final salvation (11:45, 12:13).

Understanding: The Maranatha Cry for His Return

The people who know their God will share his longing to return A people of understanding will cry Maranatha!

Dan 8 & 11: There will be incredible suffering at the end

Dan 9 & 10: Your intercession drives the divine timeline
